Horizons History

1. What is the history of Horizons?

The Horizons Grants Program was created in 1986, growing out of a community-wide Artist in Residence Program. It was the first grants program of its kind in the state. Widely respected, Horizons helps give Salina a firm reputation as a vibrant and supportive cultural community that actively cares about the artists and cultural organizations that so enrich our lives here.

2. How does a membership donation to Horizons benefit so many local artists and cultural organizations in Salina at the same time?

Horizons members give generously to the entire cultural community in Salina, creating an impact of over \$3 million since the program's beginning. Funds are distributed on a yearly basis to local artists and to organizations that submit competitive proposals which are then professionally evaluated. The significance of Horizons dollars is felt community-wide, with local artists and organizations receiving developmental support for projects, and for individual and organizational growth.

3. How is the money distributed? What criteria are used?

Grant applications are reviewed by qualified professional panelists. Panelists must evaluate applications only on the basis of specific criteria published in the application guidelines. Criteria used to determine funding are based on quality development and potential for growth of the applicant artist or organization, as well as community involvement and impact.

4. How do members of Horizons stay involved year round?

Periodic newsletters are mailed to all members, describing each artist or organizational grant in detail. In addition, there are opportunities for Horizons members to meet artists, attend special functions that give behind-the-scenes experiences, receive special seating at Horizons events, and gain recognition in programs and other printed materials.

Horizons Categories

Artist Award Recipients

Artist Awards are given to cultivate personal artistic growth, provide an engaging learning opportunity, and prepare artists to apply for the Lana Jordan Developing Artist Grant.

Lana Jordan Developing Artist Grant

The Lana Jordan Developing Artist Grant was established in 1987. The purpose of this grant is to recognize and provide financial support for committed and accomplished artists, enabling them to take their careers to new levels, build partnerships, and advance their work. Grant recipients must also implement a public component with their work to engage the community.

Organizational Project Grants

The Organizational Project Grants category was established by Salina Arts & Humanities in 1985. The purpose of this program is to provide support for organizational projects that place the arts at the heart of community development. Funds are also available to assist with the long-term development of organizations who strengthen the cultural infrastructure of the community.

Operational Support Grants

The Horizons Operational Support Program was established by Salina Arts & Humanities in 2009. The City of Salina is the main underwriter for these grants, providing administrative and program support costs to recipients. Organizations who apply for an Operational Support Grant must have a proven track record of providing high-quality arts and cultural programming that is related to their organizational mission, and that will build community and change the lives of Salina citizens.

Sudden Opportunity Grants

The Sudden Opportunity Grant is for individuals or organizational projects. These grants are characterized by their immediacy, as they fall outside the timeline parameters of other Horizons Grants.

Horizons Process

1. Idea

Idea is created by organization or artist.

2. Grant Application

Using the grant guidelines, organizations and artists complete a grant application with support from Salina Arts and Humanities staff.

3. Grants Reviewed

Grant applications are evaluated and ranked by Panelists based on grant criteria.

4. Formula

Staff computes awards based on available Horizons Grant funds and applicant ratings according to a percentage-based formula.

5. Ratification

Final recommendations for funding of grant proposals are ratified by the Salina Arts and Humanities Foundation.

6. Projects and Initiatives Happen

Shaping individuals, organizations, and community.
